

# Official Rules Wheels for Scholars Program

March 15, 2010

1. **General Information.** The National Community Pharmacists Association Foundation (NCPAF) is a 501 ( c ) 3 tax-exempt, nonprofit, philanthropic corporation, which will be conducting a campaign to Award a **2011 Chevrolet Equinox 2LT SUV** (here after referred to as the 'Award'). Donations made to this special campaign will enable the NCPAF to increase the number of scholarships it Awards to students wanting to own an independent pharmacy, as well as support other aspects of the NCPAF's mission to advance independent pharmacy, such as critical research and programs to improve the success of independent pharmacy, community service programs, low-interest educational loans to pharmacy students, and financial assistance to independent pharmacy owners for their recovery in the event of disaster, accidents, illness, or adverse circumstances.
2. **Participation.** \$100 is requested for each donation. The first 2,011 donations will be eligible for the Wheels for Scholars Program Award.
3. **Eligibility.** NCPAF donors and past donors and NCPA members including student members and family members and pharmacy affiliates are eligible to make a donation. To be eligible, the donor must be a U.S. resident, 18 years of age or older, and a licensed and insured driver. A donor to the Wheels for Scholars Program agrees to abide by all rules of the program. Determination of the interpretation of all rules and actions will be made by the NCPAF. All NCPAF decisions will be final. NCPAF Trustees and Staff are not eligible to win the Award.
4. **Award/Drawing Information.** The Award shall be a 2011 Chevrolet Equinox 2LT SUV subject to the following additional rules:
  - a) The name of the Award recipient (herein after referred to as 'Recipient') will be made available to the media by NCPAF and the NCPAF will post the Recipient's name on its website. In accepting the Award, the Recipient consents to having their name and photograph published in a variety of media in conjunction with promotional activities associated with NCPAF.
  - b) The Recipient will be selected randomly by the NCPAF. The Award ceremony will be held during the 112<sup>th</sup> NCPA Annual Convention in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania on Tuesday, October 26, 2010, at approximately 2:00 p.m. EST at the Pennsylvania Convention Center located at 1101 Arch Street. The Recipient need not be present at the ceremony. The Recipient will be notified by telephone and by certified mail. If the Recipient does not acknowledge the Award within 10 days of such official notification, NCPAF shall repeat the random process and present the Award to another eligible Recipient.
  - c) In order to be eligible to participate, donor applications must be submitted on or before Tuesday, October 26, 2010, at 2:00 p.m. EST.
  - d) Arrangements will be made with the Recipient to receive title and possession to the automobile through Steve Schmitt, Inc. in Highland, IL.
  - e) The Recipient assumes all responsibility for the 2011 Chevrolet Equinox 2LT SUV, including any sales tax, title, license, registration, dealer prep, insurance and other fees that are associated with the Award and that may apply. Additionally, the Recipient is responsible for all applicable federal, state and local taxes.
  - f) In accepting the Award the Recipient acknowledges that the NCPAF, its trustees, officers, employees, volunteers, and agents will be released and held harmless for any injuries, losses or damages of any kind, including attorneys fees and expenses, in any way related to or sustained in connection with the Award. The NCPAF, its trustees, officers, employees, volunteers, and agents disclaim any

- and all express and implied warranties, including any implied warranty of merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose regarding the Award.
- g) A maximum of 2,011 donations will be eligible for the Award. The NCPAF will refund all donor contributions if its campaign receipts do not equal the value of the Award by August 1, 2010.
  - h) Only one name may be stated on each donor application. Late, misdirected, incomplete, illegible or damaged donor applications will not be considered.
  - i) The Recipient is responsible for providing information to the NCPAF for the purpose of filing a Form W-9 with the IRS. The fair market value of the Award is includable in the Recipient's gross income. Federal income withholding must be paid upon receipt of the Award.
  - j) The amount given for a contribution to support the Wheels for Scholars Program is considered a charitable contribution for purposes of obtaining a charitable income tax deduction in accordance with federal tax laws.
  - k) The decision of the NCPAF shall be final and binding on any related matters.
  - l) All proceeds from the program, less expenses, will benefit the charitable programs of the NCPAF.
  - m) All federal, state and local laws and regulations apply. Void where prohibited by law.
  - n) A maximum of 2,011 donations will be accepted. The approximate retail value of the Award is \$29,567 (MSRP).
