GOOD NEIGHBOR PHARMACY NCPA PRUITT-SCHUTTE STUDENT BUSINESS PLAN COMPETITION

Participation in the Good Neighbor Pharmacy NCPA Pruitt-Schutte Student Business Plan Competition reached a 16-year high in 2019, with nearly 200 students and advisers contributing to the 36 business plans that were submitted to the competition. Since the competition began in 2004, more than 1,700 students have been part of this popular event. More than 70 pharmacists, business coaches, and industry leaders volunteered their time and expertise to review and provide feedback to the 36 teams that participated in the competition.

The top three teams from the written portion of the competition will present their plans at the NCPA Annual Convention on Saturday, Oct. 26, in San Diego. The competition is named to honor two great champions of independent pharmacy and former NCPA Foundation Board members: Neil Pruitt, Sr. and H. Joseph Schutte.

PHARMACY DISASTER RELIEF GRANT

Since 2005, the NCPA Foundation has provided more than \$195,000 in disaster aid. The NCPA Foundation Disaster Relief Fund was established to provide financial assistance to community pharmacy owners for the repair of their pharmacies in the event of disaster, accidents, illness, or other adverse circumstances.

In 2019 the NCPA Foundation partnered with the AmerisourceBergen Foundation, creating the AmerisourceBergen Foundation–NCPA Foundation Disaster Relief Grant Fund, established to provide financial assistance to community pharmacy owners experiencing hardship due to flooding, fire and smoke damage, winter storm damage, or other damage.
