GOOD NEIGHBOR PHARMACY NCPA PRUITT-SCHUTTE STUDENT BUSINESS PLAN COMPETITION

For 16 years, the Good Neighbor Pharmacy NCPA Pruitte-Schutte Student Business Plan Competition has promoted interest in independent community pharmacy ownership. For the 17th annual competition in 2020, 28 plans were submitted, from which three finalists were chosen. The competition is supported by Good Neighbor Pharmacy, Pharmacists Mutual Insurance Co., and the NCPA Foundation. It is the first national competition of its kind in the pharmacy profession and honors two great champions of independent community pharmacy, the late Neil Pruitt Sr. and the late H. Joseph Schutte.

PHARMACY DISASTER RELIEF FUND

It's an understatement to describe 2020 as a year where perseverance, ingenuity, and resilience have been needed. Pharmacies faced extraordinary obstacles with the outbreak of COVID-19. From erecting physical barriers and distancing throughout the pharmacy to shutting down the front end of the store and developing drive-thrus on the fly, pharmacies learned to adapt. Then in May and June, pharmacies throughout the U.S. were affected by civil unrest and experienced looting, vandalism, and even total destruction. The NCPA Foundation was there to help. With donations through the AmerisourceBergen Foundation-NCPA Foundation Disaster Relief Grant, Upsher-Smith, other corporations, and individuals, the Foundation provided approximately 150 grants to pharmacies affected by the pandemic and more than 30 pharmacies hit by civil unrest. The Disaster Relief

Fund was established to provide financial assistance to community pharmacy owners for the repair of their pharmacies in the event of natural disasters, accidents, illness, or other adverse circumstances.
